BRYAN, Justice (dissenting).

I respectfully dissent from this Court's decision not to order the presiding judge of each judicial circuit in the State to cancel jury trials for at least the next week, the week of March 16. In light of the nationwide spread of COVID-19 (Coronavirus), I believe this Court should take the extraordinary step of ordering the temporary suspension of jury trials until more comprehensive protective measures can be implemented, at which point a reassessment of the need for such suspension could be considered. Furthermore, I strongly urge the presiding judges of each circuit to consider the welfare of the most vulnerable citizens of this State when determining whether to summon dozens of citizens to a confined space for several hours simply because they received a jury summons.
